

This ancient XVII century village was declared Historical **COLONIA DEL SACRAMENTO** Patrimony of Humanity by UNESCO in 1995. The Barrio Histórico (historic quarter) of Colonia del Sacramento is designated a World Heritage Site. There is frequent ferry service across the Río de la Plata with hydrofoils completing the journey in just 50 minutes. The historical section of Colonia, which has some cobblestone streets built by the Portuguese in the 17th century, is within walking distance of the ferry terminal. The main attractions are the Old City, the Port area, Fernando Beach, the Forest Reserve and the "Real de San Carlos" with its bullfight arena, Vasque-Ball court, horse racetrack and old docks.
